# Introduction | Reflections

My work has always been about the documentation of everyday society and the individuals that create it. It is not so much a documentation of the subject, but a record of me painting them. It is about legacy and sentiment. This is why I feel the need to paint how I do; using thick, textured paint to put a part of myself into the portrait, in opposition to a photographic recording.

The exhibition is a series of single figure paintings. I invited a variety of strangers, associates and friends to come and sit for me in the studio, and through painting these individuals I explored the experience of a sitting. I took this route as they are all valued members of society and I wanted to see what worked best. With all, as expected, I felt the pressure to impress; as it is as much their portrait as it is mine. The added push with painting from life also allowed me to discover a need, passion and devotion to painting these selected individuals.

When I first visited Jamie Hill's Salon, I knew this was the ideal place to exhibit. I saw a link between my work and that of a hairdresser; the importance of the subject to feel comfortable and valued, yet also entertained. The shared focus being that we want the outcome to be representative of the time spent, and to have aesthetic acceptance from the client or sitter.

The backgrounds are minimal allowing the people in the paintings to be the main focus- like a client to the hairdresser is treated and seen. As I painted numerous characters (ranging from strangers to friends), the works are also titled using the sitters' names so that no specific connection between the subject and myself is suggested.

The paintings reflect the customer looking into the mirror in the salon, hence the title 'Reflections'. They record my version of events with my sitters, as the hairdresser records theirs through the customer's appearance. People who have their hair cut in a salon can relate to the situation portrayed through the paintings as it mirrors their experience. Though hairstyles aren't a key component in this body of work, it is an important factor in how the subjects see themselves. It is an exploration into how both the hairdresser and myself would present the individual to the rest of society.

I am a recent Fine Art graduate of Aberystwyth University, where I specialised in painting. I paint in oils using a thick, impasto style and find documentation fascinating; particularly of society, it's people, and their eccentricities. I am currently based in Swansea and undertake commissions.








